





Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Having started my work for the Edina Community Foundation in 2003, this is the 20th Annual Report for which I have chosen a theme and written an introduction. All the themes have reflected our mission to bring people together to serve, strengthen, and celebrate our community, e.g. Providing Program Leadership (2006), Celebrating our People (2013), and Bringing People Together (2021), the last being an appropriate focus for our work coming out of the pandemic.

Our Annual Report this year focuses on our work in **Engaging Our Community**, which is both an opportunity and a challenge as our lives in 2022 continued to reflect a more cautious approach to meeting with other people in public places. In this context, we are proud to have organized and hosted the 36 events described in this report, ranging from our annual Connecting With Kids Leadership Breakfast to the Edina 4th of July Parade, Veterans Dinner and Fireworks; and from beginning new charitable partner relationships with eight new nonprofit organizations to providing a Citizen of Edina column for 12 monthly issues of Edina Magazine.

We're also pleased to name more than 70 individuals and organizations who have played a key role in these events or whose volunteer work we have recognized and honored for serving the Edina community. This doesn't count the approximately 1,000 people who engaged with ECF by participating in our 4th of July Parade, the more than 20,000 people who watched the parade, or the audience members in Edina Reads and the other programs described in this report.

I've chosen a related title, Twenty Years of Engaging Our Community, 2003-2023 for a separate report that describes and names many more programs, services, and people that have been a part of ECF's service to the Edina community during the last two decades. My retirement date of March 15, 2023, is now in the very near future, and I want to express my appreciation for all the people and organizations who have been engaged in the work of ECF during my years of service.

I'm very pleased that the ECF Board has appointed Alison Briggs to serve as Interim Executive Director for a six month term. She joined the ECF staff in September of 2022 and has served with distinction as our Connecting With Kids Director and Event Coordinator. 2022 Fundraisers

Lucky Duck Fundraiser

2022 Programs

Community Impact Program

Building our community one great idea at a time, we continued to serve as an incubator for the Edina nonprofit community by offering charitable and organizational services for events, organizations, and programs led by people who live, work, or attend school in Edina. Our new partners in 2022 and their aspirational mission statements were:

- Edina Parks and Recreation—Centennial Lakes Park was formed by Perry Vetter to maximize Edina's quality of life by nurturing the health and well-being of our people, community, environment, and economy.
- Minnesota Wild Deaf/Hard of Hearing Hockey Association was formed by Antonia Gillen to instill confidence and selfesteem in deaf and hard-of-hearing athletes while building life skills through the game of hockey.




• Chowen Park Initiative was formed by Norman Bjornnes to provide private support for improvements by the City of Edina to light poles, traffic signs, and posts in the Chowen Park neighborhood.



• Neighborgood was formed by Joel Zaslofsky to cultivate a culture of care and connection, one block at a time.

- Lakers Golf Boosters was formed by Mark McCleary to support the financial, organizational, and logistical efforts of the Southwest High School golf team, a co-ed team of approximately 35 student athletes.
- Edina High School Chinese Language and Culture Club was formed by Zhuo Wang to further understanding of Chinese culture and traditions.
- Ozzy's Animal Rescue was formed by Andy Jennen to find "forever homes" for all animals, educate, and give back to the community.





• **Team Venom** was formed by Rachel Reeves to make it possible for a local group of 12-year-old boys to participate in a summer 2023 baseball tournament in Cooperstown, NY.

2022 Connecting with Kids Winners

Our CWK Connect Card program exists to help families who qualify for free or reduced priced meals (or who have a financial hardship that prevents full payment of a program fee). They can apply for a Connect Card, which gives "one-stop" access to programming with our eight community partners. With one application, students can access seven sports associations, City parks & recreation activities, and YMCA activities. Partners include City of Edina (Edina Parks & Recreation), Edina Baseball Association, Edina Basketball Association, Edina Football Association, Edina Girls Athletic Association, Edina Lacrosse Association, Edina Ultimate, Edina Volleyball Association, and Southdale YMCA.

We have issued nearly 600 Connect Cards since the program's inception in June 2016, and we issued 145 in 2022, with a total of 282 cards still current.

Veterans Dinner

The annual **Veterans Dinner** was held the night before the parade. John Currie and Patty Dronen chaired the event. Speakers included Representative Dean Phillips and representatives from the Afghan Refugee Community. Vietnam veteran Greg Moon was the keynote speaker.

Edina 4th of July Parade and Fireworks

The 2022 Edina Parade boasted 86 units and went off despite bad weather. The fireworks returned after a two-year pandemic break and were held on July 3.

The 2022 theme was Edina United–Celebrating our Past, Present, and Future. Edina Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Stacie Stanley served as Grand Marshal, along with a veteran and several student recipients of the Connecting with Kids Leadership Awards.

Community Connections



We continue to be blessed with major corporate donors whose support was not limited to the sponsorship of a specific program. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion & Justice (DEIJ)

Supported by a major grant from the MENTOR Network, we are committed to "moving Edina toward racial sensitivity, social justice, and the elimination of inequities at important touch points within the community."

In 2022, the ECF Board's DEIJ Committee hosted an Equity Innovation Journey for the Board of Directors, ECF staff, and eighteen community leaders. The YMCA of the North Equity Innovation Center conducted an Intercultural Development Inventory, assisted participants in implementing individual development plans, and led sessions on transforming workplace culture.

MENTOR funds also supported ECF's collaboration of the One Town, One Family series of community engagements co-hosted by the City of Edina, Edina Chamber of Commerce, and Edina Public Schools. Charged with the question "How do we become a community of belonging," the YMCA UnitedHealth Group Equity Innovation Center of Excellence guided hundreds of participants through interactive exercises and conversations.





2021-2022 Finances

For our fiscal year ending on June 30, our total program services expenditures (Community Impact Program Grants and Direct and Indirect Costs of Program Services) of \$444,281 were 81% of our total expenditures of \$548,055, much greater than the 70% minimum recommended by the Minnesota Charities Review Council.


Note: A net investment income loss of \$88,206, due to unrealized depreciation of equity investments, is not shown on this chart.
